State Testing

After Spring Break all grade 6-8 students will be taking the ELA and Math State Assessments. Eighth graders will also be taking the Science State Assessment. The tests are not timed. We know that an end-of-the-year test cannot possibly tell us everything about your child's academic progress. However, the results do act as a snapshot of your child's strengths and areas for improvement and can be used as a way to ensure he or she is getting the support he or she needs. The specific dates of testing will be announced in March. To decline testing for your student please use the "opt-out" form located on the MRSD District Website.

Shots are required by law for children in attendance at public and private schools, preschools, child care facilities, and Head Start programs in Oregon. Nearly every place that provides care for a child outside the home requires shots or a medical or nonmedical exemption to stay enrolled. If your child is not up to date on their vaccines, they will be excluded from school as of April 20, 2022.

School Climate

There are some very exciting times ahead. With spring right around the corner, the sun coming out, and the optional wear of masks in school beginning on Monday, you can feel the excitement in the air. This past Wednesday, the administration conducted class meetings to set us up for success that included a short presentation (see notes on the slides for context) regarding maintaining a positive school culture.

The presentation was twofold; the first half was about respecting everyone's personal decision about whether they will be wearing a mask or not. The presentation was framed in a way that helped us remember that all of us have a story, not to judge, and to be kind to one another as you never know what that other person may be going through. The second portion of the meeting was about using appropriate language at school, which does not include racial or homophobic slurs, profanity, or casting judgment on others.

Following the meeting, we asked our students to sign an <u>agreement</u> (it initially said contract, but was changed for those concerned) that they will respect other people's decisions, use respectful language while at school, and be kind to others. At its core, it simply reminded our students of what is in the student handbook. We reiterated to the students that we all need to be part of the solution for us to have a safe and respectful environment.

We are looking forward to some normalcy and a great rest of the year!

Student Body Fees

Schools throughout the nation have what is called a student body fee. The student body fee helps cover various activities that are not covered by a school budget. We ask all students to pay the fee (\$20) at the start of the year. Student body fees typically cover (though not these past years due to Covid restrictions) school socials, field trips, incentives, and school activities. They also help cover sports and activity fees for those who may not afford them. Pre-Covid, about 50% of our student body paid the fee. This number has dropped substantially this year to about a 30%. Funds not used during the school year are carried over to the next, which helps provide seed money for that next year.

One of the main things we are doing with the student body funds this year is funding our PBIS program. This program is where students earn points for being safe, responsible, and respectful at school. Students collect these points and cash them in for food and drink items in our Claw Mart (student store). The treats in the store are really popular, so popular in fact that even our 8th graders don't mind earning points to cash them in for a reward! To fund this program, we rely on a few sources. We have had generous donations from MCC and our Parent Club. We also fund this program with student body fees.

It is our hope to maintain the PBIS program include social activities this year and into the next, helping create memorable experiences for our students. If you have not paid your student body fee yet and are able, we would greatly appreciate your contribution and support. Thank you.
